

In 2009, the Reno Rodeo Denim Drive expanded to serve 8 Northern Nevada counties. With over 135 collection locations, the Denim Drive not only netted record setting donations from the collection bins, we experienced a 40% increase in cash donations of which every penny was used to purchase additional clothing. What was collected in each county stayed in each county.

The Denim Drive was so successful we were able to facilitate two "Foster Family Denim Distribution Day" events. We were also able to keep our Denim Drive closet at the Kid's Kottage full to provide clothing to infants, children and teens when they arrived at the emergency shelter and when they made the transition to foster care

Thanks to our partnership with the Washoe County Department of Social Services and the Nevada State Department of Children and Family Services, thousands of survivors of abuse and neglect now have new clothes to call their own.

SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

A Reno Rodeo Foundation Scholarship is a \$2,000 scholarship awarded annually for four years to graduates of rural Nevada high schools who attend the University of Nevada, Reno and pursue a degree in Pre-Veterinary Medicine, Pre-Medicine, Agriculture, Business, Education or Nursing. Recipients must have an overall high school GPA of 3.5 and maintain a GPA of 3.0 and take at least 12 credits per semester. Started in 1986, the Reno Rodeo Foundation scholarship program has helped hundreds of students achieve their dreams of earning a college degree.

CAPITAL PROJECT: KID'S KOTTAGE PLAYGROUND REFURBISHMENT

In the spring of 2009, the Washoe County Department of Social Services approached the Reno Rodeo Foundation to assist with the refurbishment of the Kid's Kottage outdoor play area adjacent to the KK One building. Although the building was originally used to house young children, it is now home to older children and teens. As such, the 20+ year old playground equipment needed attention. The Reno Rodeo Foundation took the lead and together with Wells Fargo and the Louis and Genevieve Capurro Family Foundation, replaced the playground equipment with fitness equipment for older residents. Refurbishment of the grass and installation of the new equipment was completed in July 2010.



RODEO STATE CHARITABLE LICENSE PLATE








FY 09-10 Total Giving \$166,998
